My father ended his service in WW2 as a prisoner of war. He was wounded and captured in France. After his surgery he was moved into a German POW camp to do hard labour. He seldom talked about the details of his life in the army or his time as a POW. One time he attempted to fill in the forms to apply for a pension he was eligible for, but he only finished about a half a paragraph describing his circumstances and left it in the middle of a sentence. He never completed the form and no one in the family knew of its existence until he died and we had to go through his papers.

What he did communicate, however, was some core values that permeated his life: patriotism, service to country and community, you have to stand up to injustice when you see it happening, and there is almost always a personal cost to be borne when you live your values. They are not free.

I write this by way of introducing the November newsletter and our theme for this month. We will look at the theme of Core Values and we'll use the story of the great Hebrew Bible prophet, Jeremiah.

Jeremiah is a hard read for most of the chapters are of doom and warnings of great perils that will occur if the people of Israel do not change their ways. The language is a precursor for great drama's like The Lord Of the Rings or Star Wars. All is not well in the kingdom and Jeremiah alternatively warns, pleads, threatens the people to wake up and to recognize that there are consequences for their straying from their core values of following Gods way. He also gives them signs of hope that the perils they face will not last forever and some day they will return from exile and will no longer be displaced people.

Our Core Values will be explored through this story that is now about 3000 years old as well as through the various Sundays of this rich month of November. The First Sunday is Nov. 1 and we'll celebrate All Saints Day and remember the legacy that we have received from the people who have gone before us. We'll also share a virtual communion. Second Sunday we will observe Remembrance Day and rededicate ourselves to peace with justice in a very unsettled world. The third and fourth Sunday's we'll come closer to home and look at the Core Values of BVU. We'll also bid farewell to our 2019-20 Christian Year and for the last Sunday of November we'll welcome the start of a new Christian Year with the First Sunday of Advent.

November, you come for us whether we are ready or not. And you bring a time of stripping away the foliage. So our main branches are revealed. And we ready ourselves. To meet whatever may come. Indeed to say: Bring it on.

# Building Info

## **BUILDING REDESIGN PRESENTATION**

On Monday Oct 26th, the BVU board and trustees met with the building redesign working group to hear and see their presentation on a proposed renovation project and design for the Cedar Hill Cross site which will eventually become our permanent home. The board was excited by the presentation and design and endorsed its readiness to go to the congregation as a whole for their first look at the proposal and a chance to interface with it.



While the hope and the plan had been to have a series of in person presentations and the Q&A session to follow, the recent rise in COVID19 cases and the further restrictions being asked by Dr Bonnie Henry left us feeling like we should shift to an online option instead so as to not risk the health of anyone in our community nor to become a super spreader event.

What is therefore being proposed is that we offer 3 zoom presentation times allowing for 50 or so each time. People can sign up for the time that suits them best by registering [HERE](#). If the 3 time slots are not enough, we will add more.

Each session will feature a video presentation by the building redesign working group and then folks will be in breakout groups with a facilitator who can answer questions and gather feedback. Once the process has been completed, the video presentation will be available online for folks to view again or see for the first time if they were unable to attend one of the presentations. Once the feed back has been gathered, disseminated and integrated, a written report and final proposal will go to the congregation in early 2021 prior to a congregational meeting where a vote will be held to approve the design and the budget. Once the approval of the congregation is received, the proposal must also receive the approval of the Pacific Mountain Region. Once that has all been approved, we can proceed with the renovations.

We are excited about the proposal and the ways it will enable the mission and ministry of Broad View United to be enabled and for the ways it will enable us to partner effectively with other organizations through the community hub being created in the lower hall. We look forward to sharing this with you.

<sup>1</sup> In March, April and May BVU was reeling under what it meant for worship to be on-line, for staff to be working from home, for all of us learning zoom, for many of us to be home-bound, and for the dislocation of not seeing people – friends, family, loved ones we were not currently living with. Our lives revolved around the Prime Minister's morning briefing and Dr. Bonnie Henry's 3 p.m. briefing. We were in a strange new world. You showed your support for your church and you found non-Sunday ways to give to BVU. Thank you.

<sup>2</sup> June, July and August: Along with many other organizations we scrambled to meet payroll, fulfill commitments and continue being a source of kindness, support, compassion. We began to find ways to keep in touch, celebrate important milestones all while striving to keep everyone safe. We learned new vocabulary: CERB, social distancing, being together by staying apart... We were adrift in some ways. We were living in a pandemic and the previous historical experience was 100 + years ago. There was no proven path to trod and we daily had to gather up our gumption and keep going.

Still, you showed your support for BVU and you continued to give as was possible for you – some of you offered to top-up your givings. It was all so appreciated and full of wonder. You were not just giving. You were being stewards for your church.

<sup>3</sup> September, October: We are moving into phase two – perhaps a bit earlier than expected. Our numbers are rising – there are no easy answers as to whether we will collectively do what we need to do to flatten the curve. We are tired. We have to wean ourselves off the government programs we received in the spring and summer. We are worried for our neighbours to the south and for ourselves. We are regularly invited to let fear and a sense of scarcity take over ... but...

Our experience is that God is good and you are the blessing. In your stewardship hands BVU is held and upheld. We trust that you will give what you can, when you can. Your love for your church is evident, your belief in the importance of our presence is firm and your thoughtful generosity reflects your character.
