Minister's Message



bebruary is an excellent month for BVU to focus on the theme of Celebrating Diversity in the human community. There are so many days in February that draw us to think wider and more inclusively than we might otherwise.

In 1976 U.S. President Gerald Ford officially recognized February to be Black History Month. This acknowledged an informal tradition that had been growing **in the decades since the late 1800's** in which Black communities had celebrated the birthdays of abolitionists Frederick Douglass (Feb. 14) and Abraham Lincoln (Feb. 12). Canada followed suit in December 1995 and annually recognize the contributions made to Canada by Black people.

This year, on February 1st, the celebration of Lunar New Year

began. This colourful celebration of family, gift giving and culture is

observed at this time by people in China, Hong Kong, Taiwan, Japan, Korea, Vietnam and Mongolia. Here on the west coast of Canada, the Lunar New Year celebrations are recognized as an important time for those of Asian Heritage. The festivities spill over into other cultural groups and many wear red, give greetings, know their animal horoscopes and acknowledge this as a significant week. The Asian Lantern festival that honours deceased ancestors and aims to promote reconciliation, peace, and forgiveness is held on Teb. 15th, and has also became a familiar part of west coast culture.

Feb. 15th, and has also become a familiar part of west coast culture. February 2nd offers us an illustration of how religions have evolved over the centuries. At this time in history people recognize Groundhog Day and revere Phil, the Punxsutawney groundhog, as the signaler of how much

winter is still to come. This day grew out of the Christian tradition of Candlemas when clergy would bless and distribute candles needed for winter. The candles represented the best guess on how long and cold the remaining winter would be. Candlemas has its roots in a Celtic celebration calling forth the spring. This day has become significant throughout the ages because it is the half way point between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. Daylight has moved from little more than 8.5 hours at the solstice to 12 hours at the equinox.

February 15th is Nirvana Day, the commemoration of Buddha's death at the age of 80. And the next day is Maghi Purnima, a Hindu festival where devotees carry out charity work and ritual baths.

February 25th to 26th, Purim, one of the most joyous and fun holidays on the Jewish calendar recalls the story of Esther saving her people from a ruthless adversary.

With all this richness we are excited to explore the theme of Celebrating Diversity and to do that as bravely and respectfully as we possibly can.

In keeping with this intention we are also very honoured to be invited by Saanich Neighbourhood Place to join in the Anti-Racism Bystander Intervention Training that will be led by ICA (InterCultural Association of Victoria). This will equip us all to find ways to be allies with diverse people and communities. It will prepare us to be smart and brave when we are confronted by situations of intolerance. **Please register and you'll find the** details in this newsletter and in the Friday emails.

Please read through this newsletter. Activities are beginning again in ways that are safe and measured for public health concerns. We can hardly wait to be together again and as you feel able come back in person. Till then, we'll connect virtually with all the warmth we can pass through the streaming services.

Broad View United COVID Update for Worship & Programs—Feb 2022

The following Covid Protocols will be in place for worship and groups meeting at Broad View United beginning February 1st, 2022:



- In-person attendance at either the 9:30am Bridge service or the 11:00am ConXion service will be allowed for anyone who is double vaccinated and has either the BVU pass card or is able to show proof at the door. Booster vaccination is encouraged for all those eligible.
- Online streaming of worship is now a permanent addition to what we offer and will continue to be an option for those not yet comfortable to meet in-person, who are away or travelling or who decide it is their preferred way of worshiping with us. In addition, the recorded version of the Sunday worship services will be available within an hour of the livestream ending. These can be accessed on our website.
- Our Sunday morning children's program will resume but instead of coming into worship, children will go directly to the Hall where their program leaders will be ready to welcome them back. Children ages 5-12 must have at least their first vaccine to participate.
- Youth and Young Adult groups will resume but participants must all be double vaccinated
- All small group/study groups can resume in-person if they are 10 people and under in size and participants are masked and double vaccinated. Each group will make its own decision about comfort levels within the group itself.
- Caregiver and Tots drop-in will resume for all those adults who are double vaccinated and masks must be worn at all times.
- Choirs will continue to discern what they are comfortable with and members will be notified by their director as to shifts in status from online participation as comfort grows.
- Monthly Community Meal will not resume at this time. Hopefully in March.
- Most meetings will continue to happen online unless meeting in-person will allow for greater decision making.

For all in-person gatherings, you will be required to wear a mask, practice appropriate distancing and not attend if you have any symptoms of Covid or have been exposed to a person with a confirmed case of COVID in the last 5 days. Hand washing/sanitizing is encouraged on a regular basis. No beverages will be served or consumed during worship at this time. Proof of vaccination will be required. Two air purifiers will continue to run in the sanctuary space 24/7 as well as fresh air let in through windows.

Participants will build on their knowledge of various forms of racism, and how to recognize racist acts through practical, scenario-based training. LANDSCAPING UPDATE FOR BUILDING RENOVATION PROGRAM

We have had several consultations with the landscape design company who will be helping us redevelop the gardens at the Cedar Hill Cross site. Any of the plants that can be safely moved and used in the new design we be utilized. However, a number of plants will not survive the move, are too big to shift, or would be too costly to do so. Those that we will be moving and keeping have been marked by the landscaper. Any other plants not marked can be removed by members of Broad View for their own personal use in their home gardens. Feel free after Feb 15th to come the sunken garden to retrieve or move a plant or two that might be of interest to you. While we can't guarantee that they will survive being transplanted, there is a 50/50 chance they will. We would be happy to see the plants find a new home.

TECHNOLOGY UPDATE:

We have been blessed to be able to borrow from Lumera Productions a significant amount of equipment while we have been waiting for the cameras and digital sound boards that will be used in the new building to arrive. We are putting to use those items that will help us deliver a quality worship now and then they will be moved to the CHX site when we move into that space. Thank you to Shane Archer, our technology contractor for his generous loan while we are waiting for ours to arrive. In the last 3 weeks the three cameras, their mounting hardware and the new digital soundboard have arrived. These will all make a difference to the quality of what we can record and lives stream. Its exciting to see these things coming together.

THE A ROOF FOR EVERYONE: GVAT* MINI-WORKSHOP ON HOUSING CRISIS IN SAANICH

Dear Members of Broadview United:

Do you struggle to follow the debates about housing in Saanich or wish you were better equipped to speak about housing issues to your friends and neighbors? GVAT (Greater Victoria Acting Together) is offering a mini-workshop on housing in Saanich, organized by Holy Cross, St. Patrick's, Broad View United and First Unitarian Churches (all member associations of GVAT), on Feb. 26.

The workshop is mainly for residents of Saanich and is intended to: inform participants of the gap between current and projected housing needs in Saanich, and the available housing supply; dispel biases and misconceptions against renters and residents of social housing; invite participants to imagine truly inclusive communities (sharing space with others); create understanding of different Housing terms (market, affordable, social, supportive, emergency).

Saanich Councillor Zac de Vries will give a presentation on Saanich housing needs and how Saanich Council plans to address these needs. A Q&A period will follow, after which participants will divide into small groups to discuss different questions related to housing and inclusive neighborhoods. The workshop will conclude with suggestions for follow-up actions.

Refreshments will be served if allowable under prevailing public health rules. Due to Covid 19 restrictions and the interactive nature of the workshop, the number of participants is limited to 40. 
