MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Do you have a favourite 'visiting' story?

In my second year of university, in a Religious Studies class, I was introduced to Rumi's* poem about 'visiting'. Like an angel's greeting, this poem revisited me, unexpectedly, in this week before the first Advent. When I was younger, I understood less than the 1/3 of the meaning of what this poem could offer. Now, I can do a little better,

I thought. I invite you to read this poem about a visit.

One went to the door of the Beloved and knocked.

A voice asked: "Who is there?" He** answered: "It is I." The voice said: "There is no room here for me and thee."

The door was shut.

After a year of solitude and deprivation this man returned to the door of the Beloved.

He knocked.

A voice from within asked: "Who is there?"

The man said: "It is Thou."
The door was opened for him.



Traditionally, we encounter two 'visit' stories in Advent. The angel Gabriel's visit to young Mary, that leads to the journey Mary makes to visit her older cousin Elizabeth. These two stories are not pastel blues and pinks and purples, wrapped in an angel's shimmering wings. The angel tells Mary, "Do not be afraid". Mary's head tilts toward the angel as the angel's head tilts towards hers. Mary, in trembling acceptance of the embodied God in her body and soul, her yes being more powerful than fear, accepts her call to go above and beyond to do the birthing of the Beloved into the world. Months later, Mary "Walks in the Summer (Voices United 12)" through the heat on the hill, and visits Elizabeth, in unsurpassable confidence and joy. Mary proclaims the Magnificat, which will be BVU's theme Gospel story this Advent season. "My soul proclaims your greatness, O God, and my spirit rejoices in you, my Saviour!" Then, Mary describes what God has done and will do, a list that does not appear in Christmas cards. God has "scattered the proud..., brought down the powerful from their thrones..., filled the hungry..., and sent the rich away empty". Indeed, there are places in the world where the Magnificat is not translated from Latin because of its troublesome political and economic ideas.

The angels visit us every day, if we could only recognize it, and tell us "Do not be afraid."

The Mary's in our lives and in the world have something important to tell us. They have songs! Magnificat! "Could the world be about to turn?" (More Voices 120, Canticle of the Turning)

BVU, Let's continue to tell each other our Advent stories and share our faith.

Knock, visit and greet. Listen. Give. Act. The 365-day-a-year work of birthing the Beloveds into the world is the true colour of Advent and Christmas spirit.

Throughout the season of Advent we will be focusing on Mary's Magnificat found in the Gospel of Luke. Each Sunday we will light the advent candles, focus on the passage through the theme of the candle of the day (Hope, Peace, Love, Joy). Blue Christmas - A Service of Solace - Sunday December 18th, 7pm








INTER-VIEW—Every 2nd Wednesday at 7pm on Zoom

<u>Intercultural Ministry</u>

It's bigger than we can ever imagine....

It's been three months since I arrived at BVU, and I can say that the intercultural community at BVU is growing. About twenty people have recently joined us for English Conversation Circle or Ping Pong & Games Night, or both. It's official that we now have 100 people, who signed up for our weekly intercultural programs. Many of them are from the wider community!

Both programs are intended to reach out to people in the community - the demographics we may not see often in the church on Sunday morning. I'm grateful that we have a core group of people, who deeply care about both the programs and the people who come. It's a real honour and privilege to witness meaningful connections when a diverse group of people come together to share their stories and learn from each other.

I can also tell you how everything we do here at BVU works together. Some of the parents, who came to hear their children sing during the service, learned about our ping pong program, and spoke to me. A week later they all came to join us! Did you know that we are now renting the hall to Chinese Senior's Association on Sunday afternoon? Four of them have become regular participants to our Ping Pong





program!

The new additional programs – Intercultural Bible Study and Kang's Convenience – provide opportunities for us to create intercultural space within the church community. Using the same scripture passage we hear on Sunday morning, this Bible study helps us to engage the Word in community. We use "Mutual Invitation" as a communication tool to ensure that everyone has an equal chance to speak. By doing so, we honour the spirit who works in each of us. We will gather on Wednesday, Dec. 7 at 7pm right after the community meal. We will deepen our understanding of Mary, the mother of Jesus by studying Luke 1:39-56 together.

Kang's Convenience opens up a space for intercultural conversations. So far, we have talked about accents, language barrier, personal boundary, and a bit of my family history as well as the complicated relationship between Korea and Japan. We also talked about some uniquely Korean concepts such as

Jeong (정/情). It's the warm feeling of attachment felt between people who share a close relationship. I can tell you that we do share such affection with one another at Kang's Convenience. We will gather on Wednesday, Dec. 21 at 7pm. We will watch Season 1 Finale: Family Singing Contest (it's my favorite episode!), followed by a lively discussion about family! I will bring some Korean desert to share my Jeong

Angel Gifts


Thank you to all who are participating in Angel Gifts. There are cards still up for grabs, you can pick one up from Charlotte in the office.

Jesus' Baby Shower: Dec 25, Jan 1st and Jan 8th

One of the ways we work to make a practical impact for those living on the edges is to support the work of the Saanich Neighbourhood Place (SNP). After Christmas many young parents struggle with making ends meet and these supplemental items go a long way in supporting children and families at risk. SNP serves young parents between the ages of 13 and 28. Because



most live on income assistance, they often don't have enough for necessities because their shelter allowance is low, therefore some of their support money must go to rent. That leaves most families very short of money for food and other essentials. Christmas and the weeks that follow become an added strain. You can help by bringing one of the following items: diapers - sizes 4, 5 and 6 (little ones stay in the large sizes longer so therefore higher demand!), pull ups, infant formula, wipes, baby food, infant cereal, toilet paper, feminine hygiene products. These can also be dropped off during church office hours during the week. Bring these with you to the church anytime from Christmas day onward and place them under the tree. Thank you

Fairway Market & Pepper's Foods Fundraising Cards

To date we have had almost \$200 given back to us via the Fairway Market Cards. Pepper's Foods also does a program like this for BVU. This is a simple program that is similar to the previous Thrifty Foods program. Simply pick up a card from Charlotte at reception, load the card, do your grocery shopping, pay with the loaded card, and 5% of your total will come back to the church! Christmas is coming, and perhaps a pre-loaded Fairways Gift Card or Pepper's Foods Card would make a perfect gift for someone in your family??




You're invited to join us for Christmas Day service with candles and carols, followed by ChristmaSUSHI lunch and international old games!
