



Holy Land: Unholy Conflict

"Holy Land: Unholy Conflict" is a ninety-minute slide presentation on Palestine/Israel, with commentary by retired minister Larry Scott. For those interested in an historical overview of Palestine-Israel from biblical times to now, this presentation gives background on the present geopolitics of the region, and why a peaceful resolution of competing justice claims is complex. 30 min Q&A time to follow. 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

Lectio is a meditative spiritual practice using a passage (scripture, poem, paragraph, prayer) which is read aloud by individuals three times per set. After the first reading the group identifies a word or phrase that speaks to them. The object is not to understand what the passage says as a whole is saying, but what draws the listener's attention. The passage is read again three times, and the members of the group share a feeling or vision that the word they chose invokes. The passage is read again three times, and after this set of readings the group shares the invitation that they received for the week invoked by the word they had chosen. All are welcome to join.

Our goal at BVU is to create an opportunity for folks to sing together with others as a Spiritual Practice. It is a chance to come together to sing with your whole body and soul, to learn some new music and ways of engaging in group singing that fills up your whole self and leaves you feeling renewed and refreshed. This is a non-audition choir with two terms and a concert for sharing with others at the end of each term (Dec 8 and April 6) but this is not the prime reason to gather. We gather simply to sing and nurture your soul through the text and the tunes sung together. An additional partial term in the month of May is also being considered.
