


The Newsletter cover reminds us of an important part of our history as Canadians and as members of the United Church. This is a story we should all know and celebrate in Black History Month. In 1858, a group of settlers arrived in Victoria aboard the steamer "Oregon" from what was then the bustling mining town of San Francisco, California. The new settlers included a number of black families, part of an immigration of about 700 black settlers who came to western Canada around that time at the invitation of Governor Douglas. Charles Alexander and his wife, Nancy, were originally from St. Louis and had journeyed by covered wagon west to California. On arrival in Victoria, the Alexanders and several other families decided to move to the Saanich Peninsula. They soon decided that a church was needed. And so, the Methodist Shady Creek Church was built.

Times have brought amalgamations and changes (sound familiar?) but some of the original pews built by Charles Alexander were still in use until recently! Their story continues to be important far beyond the Peninsula and Vancouver Island. Descendents of Charles and Nancy are members of the congregation to this day.

History is a thread that weaves through this early spring month. We are getting a real sense of the denomination's 100th's Anniversary and how we will be celebrating it here at BVU. Our history as a denomination is rich with both "hits and misses", episodes and experiences that have continued to encourage us and times, actions and policies that we now lament. We will look at both the challenges

and the successes as we have special services the last four Sundays in June (see page 5 and back cover for details). Can I encourage you to plan now to attend? We will kick off with a service presented by the Women of the United Church on June 3rd, rejoice in a Festival on the 14th and conclude with cake and ice cream on the 29th.

In these extraordinary days of early 2025, I find the writings of authors like Pastor Nadia Bolz-Weber very important to my mental and spiritual sanity and balance. We are so grateful to have this community of faith, imperfect as we are, to offer support not knowing what the future holds.


BROAD VIEW UPDATES

EXTREME WEATHER EMERGENCY SHELTER UPDATE

We continue to work at putting the various pieces into place to become an Extreme Weather Emergency Shelter. At the moment we are working with the fire department and architect to determine our fire rating capacity and also continuing to work with the city on a partner agency who will provide the staffing. As soon as we officially receive the Extreme Weather Shelter permit from the city, we will inform you through social media and the Friday BVU Bits and Bytes email.



We have had a number of folks express interest in helping with this project and we will be providing and orientation to all volunteers before we begin. While we are hopeful that we still might be able to get things up and running for this year, we are grateful that it has been a mild winter as it hasn't happened as quickly as we had hoped. LEGACY GIFT TO BE CELEBRATED

The partnership with Our Place has been an important one for all three founding congregations at Broad View United. The gift of First-Metropolitan's Manse Fund will be a tremendous opportunity! As a result of that Congregational decision, made a while ago now, we are able to act at the close of the 2024 financial year. As a result, **Broad View United will celebrate on March 2nd** as this donation is the focus of a very special service of worship, at both the Bridge and ConXion services. It is our joy



to be funding three transformative projects, each offering hope, security, stability, and safety for women at different stages of their recovery journey.

First, the **Women's Therapeutic Recovery Community (WTRC)**, opening in early 2025, will be the first long-term therapeutic recovery community for women on Vancouver Island. With Broad View's support, a Healing Garden will be created as a sanctuary of safety and renewal. In a life marked by addiction's unpredictability and danger, the garden will offer space for yoga, meditation, cultural activities, and moments of connection with children, symbolizing peace, healing, and hope.

Second, for women graduating from the recovery program without children, **new second stage housing** will provide a safe, stable, and sober environment with light support. This housing will help women transition into independent living while managing mental and physical health needs and maintaining sobriety. The growing shortage of post-treatment recovery housing in the community increases the risk of relapse and instability for program graduates.

Finally, the **Family Reunification House** will offer a supportive home where women who have completed WTRC can reconnect and live with their children. This safe, nurturing space will allow families to rebuild their lives and lay a foundation for a brighter future. Research confirms that trauma-informed, sober living homes with transitional support lead to better long-term outcomes, including sustained recovery, stability, and community connection. Our Place's Family Reunification House will fill this critical gap, providing the care and stability women and their children need to heal together.

We will welcome **Lee Sundquist** as a special speaker from our Place. Mark and I will be joined by **Julian Daley** and **Allan Saunders** in the leadership of this wonderful service, followed by a time of fellowship in the Commons.


