MINISTER'S MESSAGE

Disappointment and Betrayal, Courage and Resilience - Our Lenten Journey

As we head into the Season of Lent, we do so through the lens of the experience of Jesus during his last week. The story of the Last Supper and the subsequent time in the Garden of Gethsemane, remind us that Jesus too experienced feelings of betrayal and disappointment and in spite of such, or perhaps because of such, he also shows courage and resilience. The same can be said of his followers through the events of the holy week and post-Easter.

None of us are strangers to these feelings either. On a personal level, each of us has at some point or another, experienced feeling disappointed or betrayed by those we love. The feeling of betrayal can be hard to overcome until we begin to see it as part of a larger picture. Forgiving ourselves when we've disappointed a loved one or betrayed a principal we hold dear in our life is simply a reality we must each face as part of what it means to be human. None of us get it right all the time. The key perhaps, is being able to see that we are growing and trying and to give others the same grace that we hope we might be given as we change and grow.

Jesus seems to be able to do that over and over again with those he encounters. Right up to the end, in some of his final words, he expresses forgiveness ... "forgive them Father, for they know not what they do." Jesus and the gospel writers seem to understand that sometimes in the heat of the moment, we don't see the big picture and react from our own hurt or fear. Yet forgiving others and ourselves is tied together as a wisdom that emerges in life as we come to see the bigger picture.

In the times that we are currently living, we need to call upon our wisdom of having traversed difficult relationships and issues in the past to find the courage and resilience to keep moving forward. While hiding away and hoping we wake up to a better world tomorrow is a natural response to the chaos around us, we know from experience that it is our collective voices that are needed for the tides to shift. This takes energy. And finding the balance of engaging the world and practicing self care is an important task ahead of us. To be effective we each need to be nurtured and encouraged as well. Jesus retreats frequently to be alone or with a small select few to rebalance himself for the trials and tribulations he faces. His resilience is nurtured by his spiritual practices and by his relationship to those he draws close to himself, even those who betray him. He is betrayed and yet rebuilds and trusts again.

As we move through Lent, may we too find courage and resilience. May we too learn to seek forgiveness for our betrayals and offer forgiveness to those we have been hurt by. Then, may we turn the page and move forward together to create momentum as followers of Jesus for this "Unfolding Realm of God" he so eloquently taught, dreamed, spoke of and died for.


MARCH 2ND: CELEBRATION OF CONNECTION AND HOPE!

GETHSEMANE'S CRY: A LENTEN REFLECTION WITH SHADIA QUBTI

Sunday, March 23 | Bridge & ConXion Services | 1 PM Interactive Gathering



Shadia is a Palestinian Christian from Nazareth who has worked in faithbased peacebuilding Palestine/Israel for 15 years, focusing amplifying women's through initiatives like the Women Behind the Wall podcast. Her MA studies at the Vancouver School of Theology explored Palestinian and North American Indigenous understandings of land. She currently serves as Community Animator at Trinity Grace United Church in Vancouver.

During both Bridge and ConXion services on March 23, Shadia will share with us "Let This Cup Pass: Gethsemane's Cry through a Palestinian Christian Perspective." This reflection will offer a Palestinian land-based reading of Jesus' anguish in Gethsemane, a name that means "olive press" in Aramaic.

After the service, all are invited to stay for a simple lunch with Shadia, followed by an interactive gathering at 1 PM in the sanctuary. We've named this time "Olive & Zaatar", inspired by the Palestinian practice of hospitality—"Sitting and Dipping Food Together"—as a way to foster conversation and engagement and through deeper discussion, a presentation, and O&A.




Illustration — "Identity Tree", which Shadia will use to place herself within the larger Palestinian community

A Taize style service has an unhurried, peaceful pace. Candles and periods of silence create a meditative space, and repetitious chant-like songs offer one the opportunity to calm and centre our souls.



SHELBOURNE COMMUNITY KITCHEN - TOGETHER, WE MADE A DIFFERENCE IN 2024!

Thanks to your support, in 2024, The Kitchen's wonderful volunteers packed and filled over 3,800 grocery support requests and made 584 home deliveries for our most vulnerable members. We distributed an incredible 70,675 lbs. of healthy food to over 1,603 adults and 689 children facing food insecurity in our community and kept fridges and cupboards stocked through our Pantry Program.



In our two beautiful gardens at Omnivore Acres and across the street at St. Luke's Anglican Church, we grew 10,874 lbs. of fresh produce to support programs. 332 nutritious and creative meal kits were shared which made 1,896 meals possible through our Food Skills Programs—all fostering connection and resilience.

Exciting news—construction of our newly renovated space is almost complete. We look forward to celebrating with you at the Grand Opening of our newly renovated facility this spring. Stay tuned for updates!




JUSTICE FAIR - Sunday, March 9
